QS: What's your name?

ANS: My name is Pavlos Konnosidis and I will talk to you about my father Socrates, who came from Georgia to Greece about 20 years ago. Now he is 50 years old and now they call him Romas.

QS: How did he come from Georgia, and did he encounter any difficulties in travelling? ANS: He did not experience any difficulty on the trip and he came by airplane.

QS: Why did he leave his home country?

ANS.: He believed he would make a better life.

QS: Did he take anything with him when he left, to remind him of Georgia?

ANS: Pictures and more generally, memories.

QS: When he arrived, did he feel welcome, or did he face any kind of racism?

ANS.: He did not face any kind of racism and yes, he felt welcome.

QS: Do you yourself, have any relation to the place of your origin? Have you ever been back or keep the customs?

ANS: We keep the customs and we remember my father's memories somehow through his narrations. I cannot have memories of my own, because I was not there but I keep everything close to my heart.

QS: What helped your father to integrate, morality, customs, religion? Was it easy?

ANS: All of these, all of these helped him in the incorporation.

QS: Does he feel comfortable to declare his place of origin?

ANS: Yes, because he is not of other origin, he is not Georgian, he is Greek from the Black See (Pontus).
